Challenges faced by Islamic Banking in conventional banking environment


Problem statement

A problem statement is an understandable, comprehensive but concise description of the issue to be discussed. It may contain more than one question to be answered.

Sample problem statement (Based upon research topic):

At present most of the Islamic banking institutions are operating within a conventional environment. They are trying to cope with the existing institutional structure, which is really meant for conventional/usual banking system. Lack of institutional support is making it really challenging to successfully transform an economy in to an Islamic financing system.

Questions in a Problem statement (Problem questions)



How many areas can overlap in both modes? Can we make a combination of both?

How to write a problem statement

Define the current status of problem

Write a problem or current state


Expand your problem by asking

Who, what and how does it effect

When and where is it a problem

Restate the problem (A more specific and concise statement)

Define the future and desired status of problem



Expand your problem by asking

Who, what and how does it effect

When and where is it a problem

Restate the problem (A more specific and concise statement)

Combine both current and future state

Now combine current and future state and create a problem statement. It will take 2 to 3 attempts to make it clear, concise, understandable yet comprehensive. Following criteria should be met in order to develop an effective problem statement.

- Your focus should be only on a single problem (although it may address multiple problems called problem questions)
- It should be in 7 to 10 lines
- It doesn't suggest a solution
